Our Past Projects

Throughout the years, Wild Friends students have worked on a wide range of topics including wildlife corridors, poaching penalties, outdoor classrooms, and pollinator protection.



In 2022, students successfully advocated for SB 32 which requested \$500,000 for the Public Education Department to develop an Outdoor Classroom Program.



Wild Friends helped pass legislation and create the first ever NM Pollinator Protection license plate in 2019 (SB 234).

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
